Ann Howard Managing Partner / Lead Link at Centresource

Tell us a little bit about your work in the HIT space.

Centresource is a software Product Management firm. We help mid-sized companies for whom software is a competitive advantage.

One of the largest (and most often overlooked) risks in software development is building the wrong thing, which is expensive (in terms of time and money), and in HIT, has real implications in people's lives.

What excites you about the future of HIT? What do you see as the biggest challenges?

The challenges are huge - interoperability, security, accessibility, how to leverage all this amazing data. They're bigger than any one person. Success will be a team sport, and that's part of what excites me.

Another challenge that's exciting to me is how we will manage innovation. CIOs and their teams have a tough job. They need to be cost-conscious and stick to proven, safe solutions. And they're also asked to invest in innovation and take risks.

As someone who has been part of a ton of software builds with varying degrees of success, I am obsessed with the practice of innovation management or running "safe" innovation. Committing to innovation requires both capital and time, but it's the only way to get better results than your competition. More importantly, the up side is well worth it when you're talking about human health.

What do you see as the value of being a TN HIMSS member?

You meet people with big brains who are putting their hearts into making a difference every day. TN HIMSS members are the individuals who will move this industry forward, which is why community is so important.

What advice do you give to other HIMSS members to maximize their membership?

Find a problem in the industry that excites you. Meet other people interested in that problem (ideally with different disciplines and experience) and take a proactive role in moving us toward a solution.

What was your favorite recent TN HIMSS activity or event?

It's hard to beat the holiday party, but Eric Thrailkill's recent talk at C3 inspired me to do more. I did learn valuable theory and took away actionable information, but in listening to his vision for our city, I also saw ways that I could contribute personally.

What is the last book you read?

I usually have a fun book and a business book going at the same time. My CFO lent me Nick Hornby's Songbook, and I'm working through Business Model Generation (Osterwalder & Pigneur) again for Centresource.
